





ea Johnson was a high school track star and one of the best basketball players in Arizona in 1983, but the state's spring athletics schedule made participating in both sports impossible. Forced to choose, Gea picked track. Her choice led quickly to a gold medal in international competition.

In 1985, she was a member of the United States team of elite athletes who competed in the International Sports Exchange track meet in China and Hong Kong, and she returned home as a gold medal winner in the hurdles and the long jump. Excellence in those two events might satisfy most ath-letes, but Gea is a champion heptathlete, an athletic province that requires mastery in seven events.

The heptathlon includes the 100-yard high hurdles, 200-yard dash, 800-meter run, javelin throw, shot put, long jump and high jump. She holds the nation's highest juniors score in the heptathlon and has been Arizona's heptathlon champion for the past two years. In 1985, she won the heptathlon championships at the prestigious track and field competition held annually on the campus of Mount San Antonio College in Walnut, California.

Representing Washington High School, in Phoenix, Gea also broke Arizona All-State Athlete records in the 100-meter hurdles and the long jump and was runner-up in the shot put and 300-yard hurdles. Her coach, Bruce Frankie, says she's "a super athlete who combines talent and hard work to earn what she accomplishes."

Before concentrating on track events, Gea played varsity basketball at Corona del

Sol High School in Tempe, Arizona, and on the national team of the Basketball Congress International. At the same time, she was a member of the varsity volleyball team. In 1985, Gea was awarded the prestigious Dial Award for outstanding high school athletic performance.

Gea's academic performance matches her athletic achievement. Her scholastic record exceeds the 4.0 grade-point-average maximum - enrolled in the honors pro-

But knowing how to market his muscles is just a part of how he became successful. Arnold, like Stallone, is a perfectionist, a workaholic at his best. He expects perfection all the time and in his own words states emphatically, "If you can't give 100%, then get out of what you're doing."

Arnold's future centers around wanting to direct, produce and star in his future films. "I want it all," he says. Today, Arnold enjoys his hero image with his *Commando* persona. There's talk of a sequel, which means that *Commando* made enough money for all concerned, and everyone would like to try again, thanks. It's safe to say that Arnold's only Hollywood rival right now is (who else?) Stallone. Together, the Italian Stallion and the Austrian Oak have a world monopoly on strong-but-silent action roles.

To add a bit of irony to this story, that six-foot Danish model who costarred with Arnold in *Red Sonja* and who played the evil Drago's wife in *Rocky IV* is in real life Brigitte Nielsen — Mrs. Sylvester Stallone.

Today Arnold is a millionaire and a real estate mogul and a movie star. Soon he'll even be a *Kennedy*. Is it true what I've heard — that Stallone has got himself a New Wave-ish *Commando*-style haircut? Doesn't matter, Sly. *Nobody* will ever come close to our Arnold!
