Johnson Cracks 6000

Tempe, Arizona, March 23-24—Even if Gea Johnson was under the weather at the Sun Devil Invitational, she was certainly on top of her game. The Arizona State junior tallied 6129 heptathlon points, a PR improvement of 139 that moves her to No. 6 among Americans all-time.


"She'd been having little problems with just not feeling well for the three days before the meet," said coach Tom Jones, "So she took time off. You get a little bit of a compensation effect from that."

Apparently so, as the 5-7/140 NCAA favorite (see p. 8) PRed in a number of events, including 13.70 in the hurdles and 20-61/2 in the long jump.

"My javelin [135-2] was very weak," admitted Johnson. "My 200 [24.78] wasn't the greatest; my shot [44-2] wasn't the greatest. I just hope I can keep on improving."

Another big breakthrough came in the men's 400, where Washington footballer Orlando McKay, a soph, skipped the 46s and cruised 45.81. That's an improvement of 1.39 on his old PR, 47.20 in last year's Pac-10 heats.

Pettigrew is rolling already outdoors.


FLORIDA STATE RELAYS Don't Forget Pettigrew

Tallahassee, March 23-24—He was not much of a factor indoors, but expect Antonio Pettigrew to play a major role again this outdoor season. That's the message the Miami-Dade South soph gave at the Florida State Relays, despite coming off a minor stress fracture which had cost him 3 weeks of training.

Down by almost 10m when he got the stick on the anchor of the 4 x 4, the defending TAC 400 champ came up just short in his bid to catch lowa State hurdler Michael Graham. Pettigrew's 45.3 brought the JC squad home in 3:06.96, a scant 0.04 behind the 4-year boys.

lowa State's women also had a chance to shine, Jacqui Parker's 2:05.7 anchor giving the Cyclones a 3:51.74 in the sprint medley, the No. 6 time ever recorded.

Overall, host Florida State picked up the most relay glory, its men winning the 4×8 and both medleys and the women the 4×1 , 4×2 , and 4×4 .
